1.1 General information

MyOffice Presentation lets you view and display presentations on Linux and Windows operating systems.

MyOffice Presentation is included in the following suites:

- MyOffice Professional 2
- MyOffice Standard 2
- MyOffice Education

2 BEFORE YOU BEGIN

2.1 Install the application

The installation procedure for MyOffice solutions is described in the document entitled MyOffice Text, MyOffice Spreadsheet, MyOffice Presentation Desktop Applications. Installation Guide.




Figure 1. MyOffice desktop shortcuts for Windows OS




Figure 2. MyOffice Start menu shortcuts for Windows OS

If you installed MyOffice solutions on Windows OS according to the procedure described in Section 2.2 of the above-mentioned document and you see the shortcuts shown on Figure 1 and 2 on your desktop and on the main menu of the OS, that means you've successfully installed MyOffice Presentation.




Figure 3. MyOffice desktop shortcuts for Linux OS

If you installed MyOffice solutions on Linux OS according to the procedure described in Section 2.3 of the above-mentioned document and you see the shortcuts shown on Figure 3 in the applications menu of the OS, that means you've successfully installed MyOffice Presentation.

2.2 Launch the application

To launch MyOffice Presentation, click or double-click the icon or the shortcut of the application.

2.3 License Agreement




Figure 4. Terms of Use and Privacy Policy window

When you run MyOffice software for the first time, carefully read the terms of the License Agreement and the Privacy Policy (see Figure 4). If you agree with the terms, click **Accept**.

3 INTERFACE OVERVIEW

The MyOffice Presentation main window has the following elements:




Figure 5. Main window of MyOffice Presentation

- Slide pane (see Figure 5, 1).
- Navigation pane (see Figure 5, 2): Displayed when placing the cursor on the left border of the main window.
- Toolbar (see Figure 6): Displayed when placing the cursor on the lower border of the main application window.

The Navigation pane (see Figure 5). The Navigation pane contains numbered slide thumbnails and allows to quickly <u>move</u> from one slide to another.

The Toolbar (see Figure 6) contains the following buttons:

- ← **Previous:** <u>Return</u> to previous slide.
- Next: Move to the next slide.
- Exit Full Screen Mode / Full Screen Mode: Enter/leave the Full Screen mode.
- **Pointer:** Enable or disable the laser <u>pointer mode</u>.
- Open: Open a presentation.
- **Save As:** <u>Save</u> a presentation.
- **Print:** Print a presentation.
- **Welp:** Open help materials on how to work with the MyOffice Presentation application.

4 WORK WITH MYOFFICE PRESENTATION

4.1 Actions with files

4.1.1 Open a file

With MyOffice Presentation, you can open one or multiple presentations. Each presentation will be opened in a new window.

By default, a presentation is opened in the <u>Full Screen mode</u>.

To open a presentation file, you can use:

- File manager
- Welcome window
- Main window

4.1.1.1 Open a file in the file manager

To open a file in the file manager window, select the presentation file you want to open and double-click it.

The presentation will open in the main application window (see Figure 5).

4.1.1.2 Open a file from the welcome window




Figure 7. Welcome window

When you launch MyOffice Presentation, a welcome window appears on your screen (see Figure 7).

To open a presentation, do one of the following:

- 1. In the welcome window, click **Open**.
- 2. In the file manager, select the presentation you want to open and click **Open**.

Your presentation will open in the main window of MyOffice Presentation (see Figure 5).

4.1.1.3 Open a file from the main window

To open a new presentation at the same time with another presentation, follow these steps:

- 1. Click the **Open** button on the **Toolbar** or press **Ctrl+O**.
- 2. In the file manager, select the file you want to open and click **Open**.

Your presentation will open in a new window.

4.1.2 Save a file

With MyOffice Presentation, you can change the name of a file or its location. Follow these steps:

- 1. Click the Save As button on the Toolbar or press Ctrl+S.
- 2. In the file manager window, specify the new name and/or the location and click **Save**.

4.1.3 Print a presentation

To print a presentation, proceed with one of the following:

- Click the **Print** button on the Toolbar.
- Press **Ctrl+P**.




Figure 8. Page Setup and Print window

The opened **Print Settings** window (see Figure 8) contains the following elements:

- Print Settings pane
- Preview pane

The presentation Preview pane contains the following functions:

- and : Zoom in or out the preview section.
- **Fit:** Set the slide to the Preview pane.
- ■ and ■: Move to the next or previous presentation slide.
- Zooming in the Preview pane does not affect the presentation print area. The tool is intended for a detailed preview of the presentation content before printing.

In the Print Settings pane you can specify the settings described in Table 2.

Table 2. Print settings

Option	Action
Printer	Select a printer.
Printer properties (Windows only)	Open the printer settings window. The type and composition of the window parameters depend on the printer model selected in the Printer field.
	The settings specified in the printer settings window are automatically transferred to the corresponding fields of the Page Settings window. Settings that are not supported by the printer are not available in the Page Settings window.
Print in Grayscale	Print the color text and images contained in the document in grayscale.
Copies	Set the number of copies you want to print.

Option	Action
Collated/Uncollated	The field is available if the number of printed copies exceeds 1. Set the order in which pages are grouped during printing:
	- Collated: Print all pages grouped by copies (1,2,3 1,2,3 1,2,3);
	- Uncollated: Print pages grouped by page numbers (1,1,1 2,2,2 3,3,3).
Duplex Printing	- None: Print on one side of the page only.
	 Long-Edge Binding: Print two sides of the page and flip the paper along the long edge.
	 Short-Edge Binding: Print two sides of the page and flip the paper along the short edge.

To print the presentation, click the \boldsymbol{Print} button.

4.1.4 Close a file

Each new presentation opens in a new MyOffice Presentation window.

To close a presentation window, do one of the following:

- Click the **Close** button on the window title bar.
- Press **Alt+F4**.

4.2 Work with presentations

4.2.1 Move in between slides




Figure 9. Navigation pane

The Navigation pane contains slide thumbnails (see Figure 9). To display this pane, place the cursor on the left border of the main application window.

To select a slide that you want to display, click its thumbnail.

The slide will be displayed in the Slide pane. The thumbnail of the selected slide will be highlighted in red in the Navigation pane.

Slide thumbnails are consequently numbered to facilitate navigation.

You can scroll through the slides in the Navigation pane using the vertical scroll bar or the mouse wheel.

You can move in between slides using the mouse, keyboard keys, or the Toolbar.

4.2.1.1 Go to the next slide

To go to the next slide, do one of the following:

- Click the **→ Next** button on the Toolbar.
- Press **Space**, **Right Arrow** or **Page Down**.
- Left click the Slide pane.
- Click the slide thumbnail on the Navigation pane.

4.2.1.2 Go to the previous slide

To go to the previous slide, do one of the following:

- − Click the ← Previous button on the Toolbar.
- Press Backspace, Left Arrow or Page Up.
- Click the slide thumbnail on the Navigation pane.

4.2.1.3 Go to the first slide

To quickly move to the first slide, do one of the following:

- Press **Home**.
- Hold the left mouse button pressed on the visible area of the presentation until you move to the first slide.
- Click the thumbnail of the first slide on the Navigation pane.

To hide the Navigation pane, place the cursor outside the pane.

4.2.2 Full Screen mode

By default, a presentation opens in the Full Screen mode. The Full Screen mode allows you to display slides using the maximum screen size.

To exit the Full Screen mode, do one of the following:

- On the Toolbar, click the **Exit Full Screen Mode** button.
- Press **Esc**.

To return to the Full Screen mode, click the **Full Screen Mode** button on the Toolbar.

4.2.3 Pointer

If you want to draw the attention of your audience to something on a slide, you can transform your mouse pointer into a virtual laser pointer.

To do so, click the **Pointer** button on the Toolbar.

To exit the laser pointer mode, click the **Pointer** button one more time.
